		<p>BMBC Traffic have made contact with the property complained about Jill contacted Stagecoach 27.03.2024 and they said that although they don't keep a log of cancelled bus services, the driver is entitled to refuse part of a route if it is unsafe. Stagecoach said there are six buses that travel along Park Avenue but they need the number of the bus. Can residents confirm?</p> <p>01/05/2024 Residents complained again that on 30.04.2024 buses were unable to get through. Highways have a meeting with bus operator scheduled 01.05.2024. They will feed back. Site visit involving SYP, Parking and Highways to be arranged in June. Attendees asked if a letter could be sent to "a certain resident" re his inconsiderate parking on the street. Officers explained again that this resident is not parking illegally so no action can be taken</p> <p>Although JG not present at this PACT, can confirm at time of writing minutes a letter has been sent to the "certain resident" asking them to be mindful of how they park and how this may affect other residents</p> <p>26/06/2024 - PCSO's Holmes and McFadzean updated the meeting about the meeting they held with Highways. They have met with Damon Brown the Head of Highways for BMBC. Damon advised he had attended a higher level meeting about this issue with Stagecoach and also SYMCA (South Yorkshire Mayor Combined Authority). It has been highlighted as an area to do some work but no timescales have been given for when this work will take place and what the work will be. PCSO's advised they have tried to speak with the Ward Alliance about some signage about double parking. Locals Cllrs are currently in pre-election period so nothing can be done until after 4th July.</p>
