Issues Raised at previous meeting and Current Issues of Concern

	Summary of Concerns	Response / Action required	Lead Agencies
Nigel Bailey	Raised about parking on estates and not being able to get buses through.	<p>PREVIOUS UPDATES CAN BE FOUND ON LAST MEETING MINUTES</p> <p>BMBC's DB explained that parking issues in the area were acknowledged however they do not have the resources to regularly patrol. It seems the worst times are school drop off and pick up times, and then generally, throughout the day, drivers making a quick stop to nip into the local shops, particularly around 'Greggs'. PCSO Holmes said that he had been on patrol in the area recently and when drivers saw him, they moved on, but SYP can't be there all the time. DB advised that parking attendants try to patrol at least once a month. They were in Penistone a couple of weeks ago and issued Warning Notices around the market but there are a limited number of officers and they cover the whole of the Borough. DB to make a request for attendants to try and visit the area more frequently. Concerns raised again about Stagecoach potentially stopping bus services in Park Ave area and early on today, before the meeting, a paramedic couldn't get through to attend an emergency. Suggestion from resident about using cameras but BMBC would have to take in those powers at significant cost and there is no budget for that so currently relying on foot officers for enforcement.</p> <p>'Park Safe', a scheme where members of the public can use some traffic calming measures was raised. Sgt to look into this</p> <p>Officers will continue to patrol whenever they can. Sgt Daniels to put a post on SYP social media explaining "the dangers of parking obstruction" and Nigel will also promote this on the PTC website.
